(Faith)



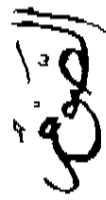
To believe in no God but Allah and that Muhammad is his prophet and the messenger of Allah.



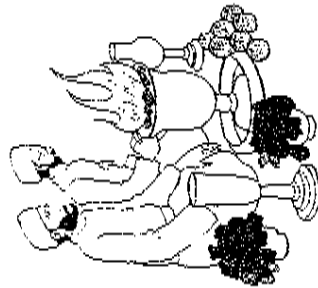
Salah

To give up food and drink during daylight hours in the month of Ramadan.



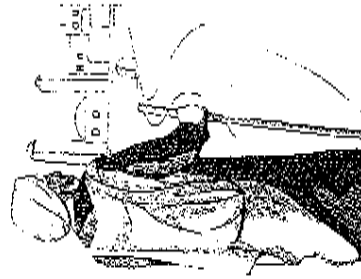
Zakah

To perform a pilgrimage to Mecca at least once in a lifetime.

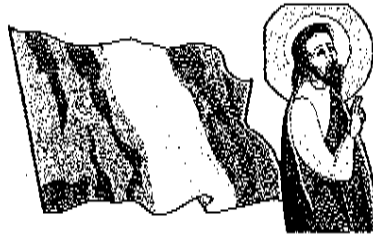
SAINTS

SAINT GEORGE



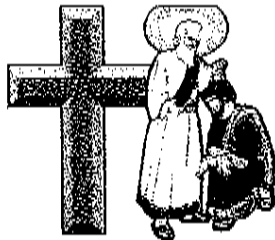
Patron Saint of England, remembered on April 23rd. Said to have fought and killed a fierce dragon.

SAINT ANDREW



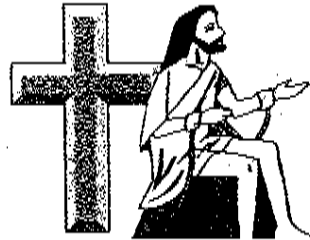
Patron Saint of Scotland, remembered on November 30th. A disciple of Jesus put to death on an x-shaped cross.

SAINT PAUL



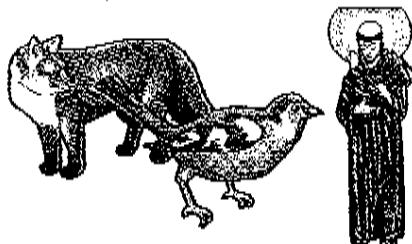
A missionary who travelled on many journeys to persuade people to become Christians.

SAINT PETER



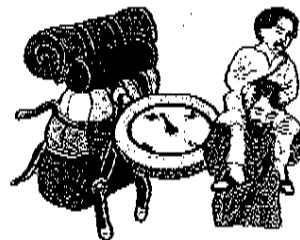
Jesus called him the rock on which the Christian Church was founded. Saint Peter was one of the Apostles.

Patron Saint of travellers. He is said to have carried the Christ-child across the river.

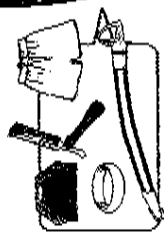
I am a SIKH



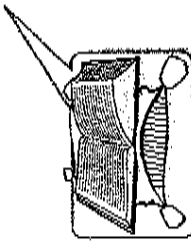
Sikhism was born 500 years ago in Punjab, India. It is a religion of peace and equality for all.

I pray at home and in the Gurdwara.



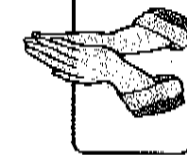
I am mainly vegetarian but I can sometimes eat certain meats.

I am a CHRISTIAN

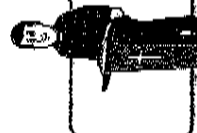
Christians are the followers of Jesus Christ. Christians believe the Bible is the word of God.



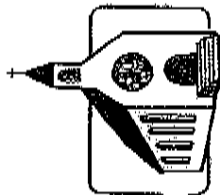
I worship God as Father, Son (Jesus), and Holy Spirit.



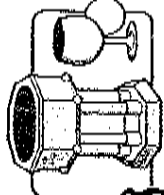
I try to follow the teachings of Jesus Christ in the New Testament.

I pray at home and in a church or chapel.



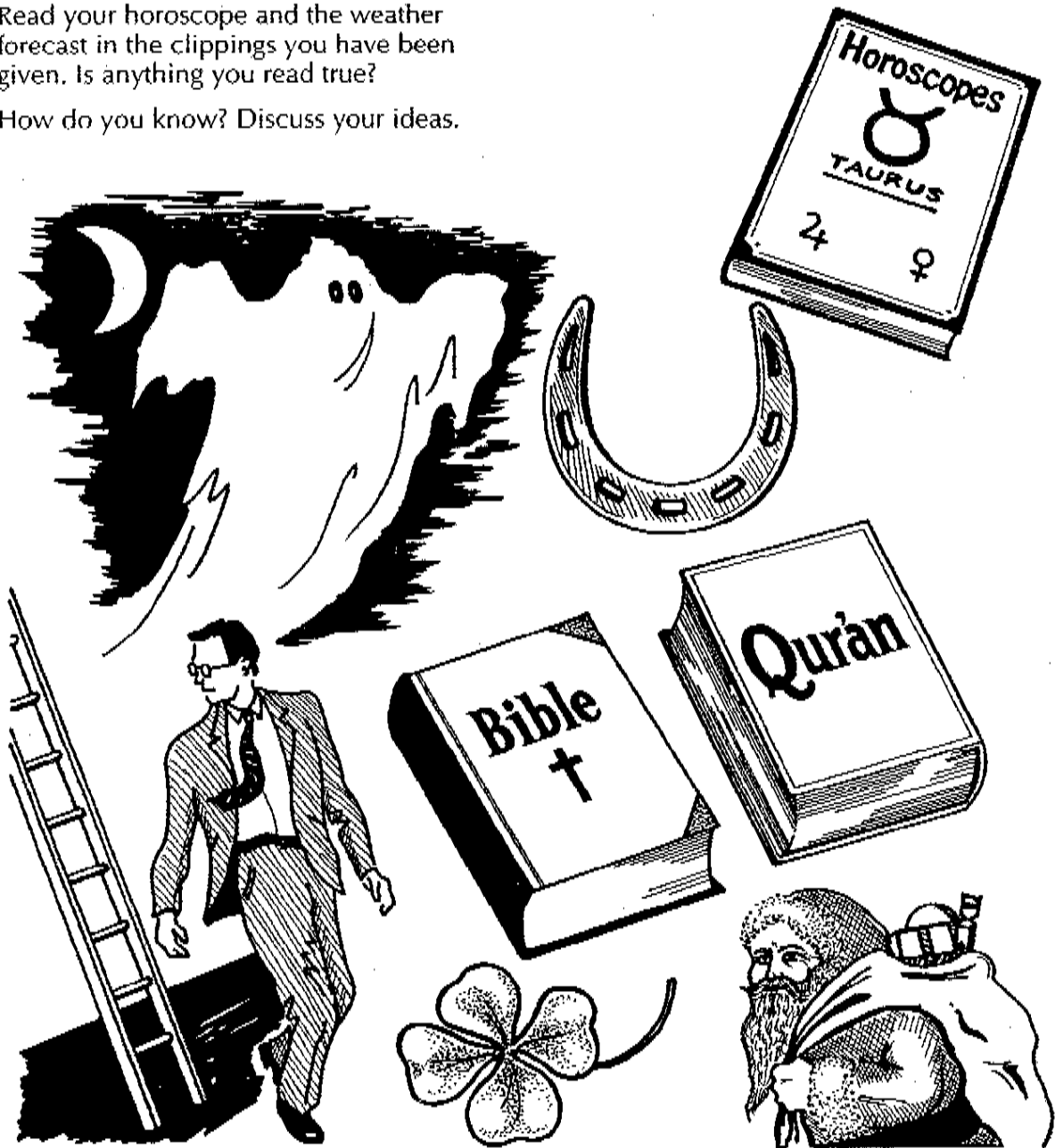
We celebrate the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion.
