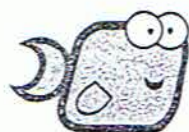
It can be a real one or you can totally invent your own religion.

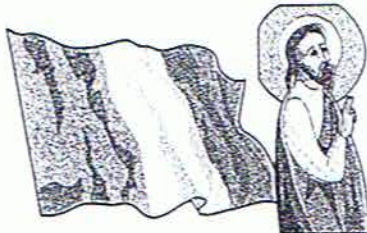
SAINTS

SAINT DAVID



Patron Saint of Wales, remembered on March 1st. The cathedral at St. David's was built on the site of David's monastery.

SAINT PATRICK



Patron Saint of Ireland, remembered on March 17th. Patrick brought Christianity to Ireland.

SAINT GEORGE



Patron Saint of England, remembered on April 23rd. Said to have fought and killed a fierce dragon.

SAINT ANDREW



Patron Saint of Scotland, remembered on November 30th. A disciple of Jesus put to death on an x-shaped cross.

SAINT PAUL



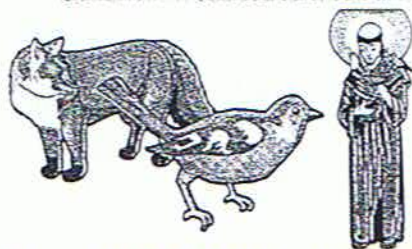
A missionary who travelled on many journeys to persuade people to become Christians.

SAINT PETER



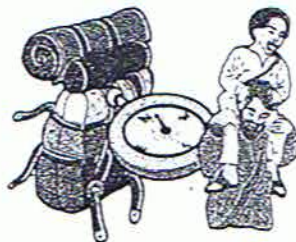
Jesus called him the rock on which the Christian Church was founded. Saint Peter was one of the Apostles.

SAINT FRANCIS



Patron Saint of animals. He gave all his belongings to the poor and founded a religious order.

SAINT CHRISTOPHER



Patron Saint of travellers. He is said to have carried the Christ-child across the river.

THE QUR'AN

The Qur'an is the holy book of Islam. It means 'read aloud' and is written in Arabic.



There are 114 chapters (surahs) arranged in order of length, in 30 parts.



The words were recited to Muhammad over 23 years by the Angel Gabriel (Jibril).



Muhammad memorised the words as he could not read or write.



Disciples of Muhammad wrote down the Prophet's revelations.



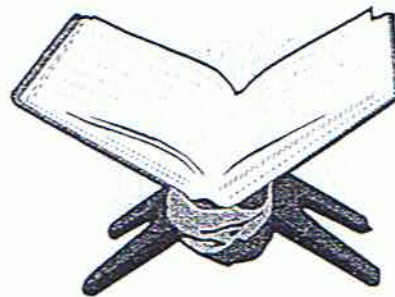
The collection of writings was placed together in one book called the Qur'an.



The Qur'an is always kept clean and treated with respect.



The Qur'an is wrapped and kept on a high shelf.



Whilst being read, it is placed on a carved wooden stand.

These are the duties of Islam, the religion of Muslims.

الشهادة

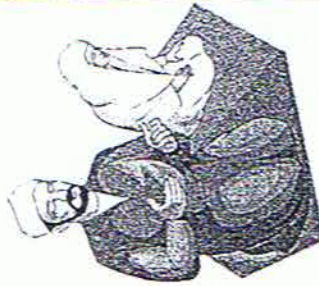
Shahadah
(Faith)



To believe in no God but Allah and that Muhammad is his prophet and the messenger of Allah.

الصلاة

Salah
(Prayer)



To pray five times each day:
Fajr - Before Sunrise
Zuhr - Early Afternoon
Asr - Late Afternoon
Maghrib - After Sunset
Isha - Night.

الصوم

Sawm
(Fasting)



To give up food and drink during daylight hours in the month of Ramadan.

الزكاة

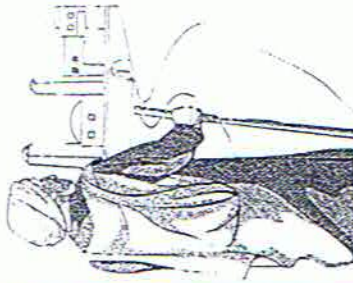
Zakah
(Almsgiving)



To give a share of personal wealth to help people in need and support the Muslim community.

الحج

Haji
(Pilgrimage)



To perform a pilgrimage to Makkah at least once in a lifetime.
