

HOMEWORK PROJECT YEAR 9 FOUNDATION LEVEL

As you are probably aware, in the Creative Arts this year you have been working towards your Arts Award, this means that most of you, by the end of Year 9 will have achieved your first GCSE!

One of the sections of the GCSE is that you have to produce a PowerPoint presentation. The PowerPoint must be on a famous artist. Before you start to worry it doesn't mean it is Van Gough (although you could do him if you wanted to), it is on a famous actor/ singer/ group/ artist/ stand up comedian etc, etc. The only rule is it has to be someone in the Creative/ Performing Arts (not a famous footballer! Although I must admit they do show a creative flair sometimes!)

Previous examples include:

- 50 Cent
- Zac Efron – I know I thought it was sad too!
- Armstrong and Miller
- Banksy
- Adrian Lester (Mickey Stone from Hustle)
- Lacey Turner (Stacey Branning/Slater from Eastenders)

So the important thing to remember is that this artist should interest YOU!

How to present your evidence

You must complete AT LEAST EIGHT SLIDES using Powerpoint.

SLIDE 1 – PICTURES OF YOUR FAMOUS ARTIST AND THEIR NAME – make the title look eye-catching

SLIDE 2 – THEIR LIFESTORY (Biography) – HINT Don't just copy and paste, you will fail!

SLIDE 3 – A LIST OF THEIR FILMS/ TV PROGRAMMES/ SONGS/ etc

SLIDE 4 – Choose ONE of their films/ songs etc and talk about it.

SLIDE 5 – Choose a SECOND example of their work and talk about it.

SLIDE 6 – Choose a THIRD example of their work and talk about it.

SLIDE 7 – WHY DO YOU REALLY LIKE THEM? Discuss

SLIDE 8 – More pictures of them (can you use PowerPoint effects to make the slide come on at different times, flash etc?)

8 Slides are the MINIMUM – if you want to include more – please DO!!!!

WHEN YOU HAVE ACHIEVED THIS YOU WILL HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ONE THIRD OF YOUR GCSE! I hope that motivates you!!!!

REMEMBER

8 SLIDES (minimum), DON'T COPY AND PASTE, MAKE IT INTERESTING, INCLUDE PICTURES, CAPITAL LETTERS FOR NAMES, TITLES ON EACH SLIDE.
