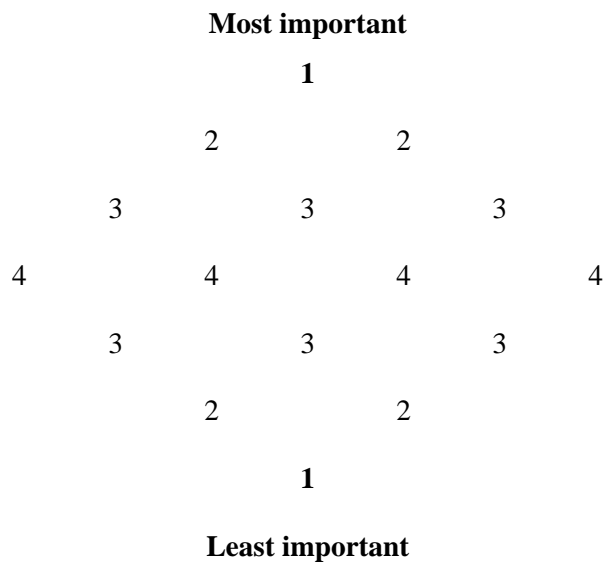
What are world issues?

- 3) Design a poster about the issue that you think is the most important

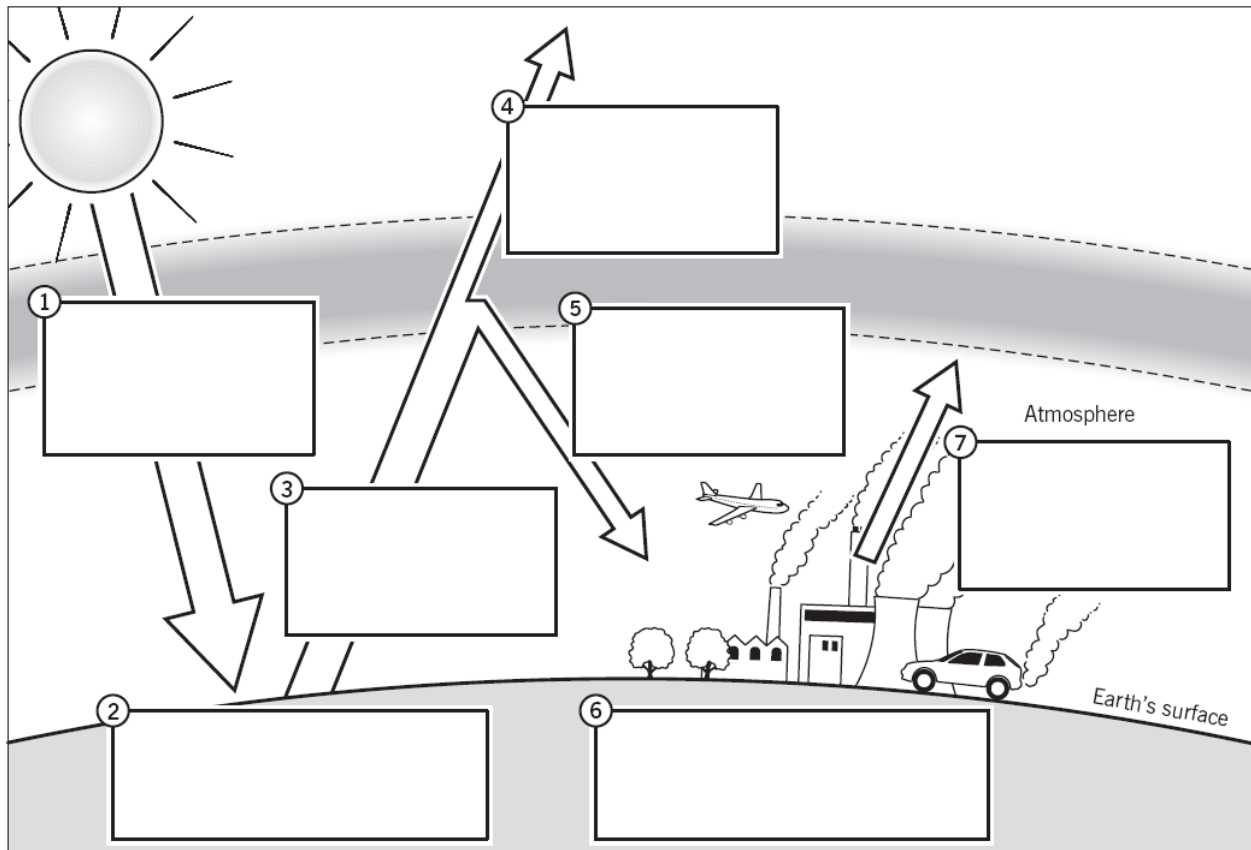


Section 2

What is Global Warming?

Most scientists believe that the burning of fossil fuels has caused an increase in the world's average temperature. This is called **Global Warming**.

Task 4: Complete the boxes on the diagram using the 7 labels below



Some heat escapes into space.

Heat is reflected from the earth back into the atmosphere.

The sun warms the earth's surface during the day.

The sun's rays pass through the atmosphere to the earth's surface.

So the atmosphere gets warmed up.

Thermal power stations burn fossil fuels and removing forests increases the level of carbon dioxide.

The earth loses heat at night. Carbon dioxide and other gases in the atmosphere trap some heat.

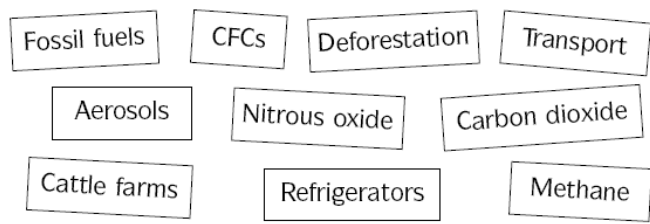
The diagram above shows how many scientists believe that global warming is caused.
