



## ADMISSIONS TO SIXTH FORM

Adeyfield School is a community school maintained by Hertfordshire LA who manage the transfer of 11-16 admission to the school in accordance with their published admissions criteria.

Admissions to the Sixth Form are the responsibility of the Headteacher and Governors and applications for admission should be made via the on-line application process at the following website [www.hertschoices.org.uk](http://www.hertschoices.org.uk).

An agreed set of criteria have been developed within the East Dacorum Partnership with personal guidance being given by each school to help students decide the level of courses that should be followed Post 16. As a guide, the details below indicate a good choice for different Average Point Scores (APS).

#### **APS of between 28 – 39**

Students who achieve this APS should be considering a Level 2 package as a progression route Post 16. Each school within East Dacorum offers its own combination of qualifications, all of which include GCSE English Language and Mathematics.

#### **APS of 40 or more**

Students who achieve this APS including at least a C grade in either GCSE English or Mathematics should be considering at least three Level 2 Post 16 courses.

#### **APS of more than 44**

Students who achieve this APS including at least a C grade in GCSE English and Mathematics should be considering four Level 2 Post 16 courses.

#### **Additional requirements**

Adeyfield School is a comprehensive Sixth Form and does not select students on ability. Admittance to Post 16 is dependent on a student's attendance, attitude and behaviour. All students making an application to the Sixth Form are interviewed before being offered a place. The final offer of a place is not made until August when the GCSE results are published.

#### **Further Information**

Adeyfield School offers students a wide range of experiences and is committed to securing the best possible outcomes for students. For all students attendance to RE, PSHE and PE are compulsory. There are further opportunities to take become involved in the School Council and participate in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme.

The school operates a strict dress code which is that students are expected to present themselves in a way appropriate for work in a professional office. Male students are expected to wear a shirt and tie and females appropriate office clothing.
