We would therefore like to acknowledge the crucial role parents, guardians, and the entire community have played in shaping the success of our students. Their unwavering encouragement and support have contributed significantly to this year's achievements. The results are a testament to the collective commitment towards nurturing academic excellence and fostering personal growth.

We are elated to declare that a number of students have achieved results beyond expectations. A particular highlight was Dhylan who achieved several grade 9's. The diligent efforts put forth by our students have resulted in an exceptional pass rate, reflecting our commitment to maintaining high standards of education.

Our students have also excelled in a diverse range of subjects, showcasing the breadth of our academic offerings and empowering students to explore their passions and excel in their chosen fields. 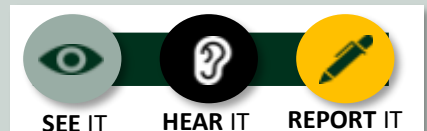
BULLYING, RACISM, DISCRIMINATION, PREJUDICE

BRECK FOUNDATION

The Breck Foundation visited Year 7 during their September induction and shared Breck's story to educate our students about the risks of online grooming to empower them to make better choices when interacting online, leading to safer outcomes. They presented an age-appropriate and engaging way using Breck's real-life story, teaching an ethos of Play Virtual / Live Real and emphasising that online friendships are not the same as real-life relationships. Students attended the online safety assemblies and were reminded to never meet up alone or in a private place if meeting an online friend. TALK THE TALK: TALK ABOUT TRANSITION WORKSHOP

Expert trainers from Talk The Talk came into the academy on Tuesday, 5th September to work with our new Year 7 students. Their workshop Talk About Transition used oracy-based activities and strategies to help students develop greater self-confidence and resilience. The half a day workshop was packed full of engaging activities to promote students' confidence, self-esteem and help build relationships with their new peers, Talk About Transition supports students in a successful transition from primary to secondary school.

We are aware that transition to secondary school involves changes that can be both exciting and a cause of concern to students. Successful transition is vital to the development of students' self-confidence, self-esteem and academic competence. Moving on from the safe haven of primary school - one classroom and often one teacher - to a much larger school and the feeling of being a 'small fish in a large pond' can cause worry and anxiety. Talk The Talk's programme help students embrace this change and allows students to talk about their concerns and how to overcome them – but also the fantastic opportunities that await them – and how best to embrace these.
