


October is the month that we celebrate Black History Month here in the UK and at The Adeyfield Academy in addition to our regular curriculum which covers diverse backgrounds. Nationally this year's theme is 'Celebrating Our Sisters' so we will be shining a light particularly on the contributions of black women throughout the month.

Students across the school have all had an assembly which tells them all about what Black History Month is and why it is important to celebrate the contributions and stories of people from Africa and the Caribbean. The assemblies focus on four individuals to share with students some stories that they may not have been aware of; Nichelle Nichols, the first black women to have a main role on a TV show in America, Diane Abbott, the UK's first black female MP, Wangari Maathai, the first black woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize and Kanya King the founder of the MOBO awards.

In addition to the assemblies, students will have the opportunity to show off their knowledge in our house competition BHM quiz which is taking place on the 17th October.

Staff have also been sharing their inspirational figures from black history in posters on the classroom doors to introduce students to even more individuals.

On Tuesday 26th September, the Spanish department celebrated European Day of Languages.


All year groups attended an assembly about the importance of languages in our day to day lives. Students also participated in a quiz to test their knowledge about how many languages are spoken worldwide.




















YEAR 11 ART TRIP TO THE NAUTURAL HISTORY MUSEUM IN TRING
