PAUL HANNAFORD ASSEMBLY





Throughout his presentation, he addressed the topics of knife crime, county lines, substance abuse, gang involvement, firearms, bullying, and prison. Paul shared honest revelations and personal insights to highlight the severity of these issues and the importance of making informed choices. He also explained the deceptive nature of county lines and empowered our Year 7 and 8 students to be vigilant. Paul Hannaford's visit left a lasting impression, inspiring students to make wiser decisions and look to an alternate path in order to create a better society.

TRUSTED ADULTS

Students were asked to complete a safety network by drawing around their hand and selecting their trusted adults. 
DRAGONS' APPRENTICE










HOLDING THE FLAG

YEAR 12 FISH HEAD BIOLOGY PRACTICAL




In Biology class, Year 12 students had the opportunity to dissect fish heads. As part of their study, they were required to identify and measure the gills, which they observed expanding in water


