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CHELSEA'S STORY

Last week, Year 9 students watched the performance 'Chelsea's Story' an internationally renowned Applied Theatre Production that raises awareness around the issues surrounding Child Sexual Exploitation.

It tells the story of a group of three students who discover the diary of a girl called Chelsea.



Chelsea was a 15 year old girl who, having fallen out with her friends and family, met a guy called Gary. Gary was kind, understanding, had a nice car, had his own flat and listened to her. Unfortunately Gary was not what he seemed to be! Chelsea's story is played out and examined by the three students who, along with their teacher, attempt to understand what happened to Chelsea. The performance addressed:

- What makes a Healthy Relationship
- What makes an Unhealthy Relationship
- Safe Internet Use/Sexting
- What is Consent
- The Grooming Process, Child Sexual Exploitation & the differing methods
- Avoiding Victim Blaming
- Where to go for help & advice





TALK THE TALK - TALK ABOUT COMMUNICATION

On Friday 19th January, Year 10 students worked with expert trainers from the education charity **Talk The Talk**. **Talk The Talk's** mission is to improve their communication skills to enable positive interaction in all life situations.

The workshop *Talk About Communication allowed students to* explore different modes of communication, develop effective use of structuring in short talks and presentations and apply persuasive language techniques to get their message across confidently and effectively.

Talk The Talk has trained over 28,000 students in the past twelve months in England and Wales and nearly 85,000 since we first started - using a suite of programmes developed over the past seven years.

When asked what skills they lacked when they entered the workforce, 50% of workers said confidence, 23% said communication and 19% said the ability to look after their mental health. The tasks most likely to make people feel nervous require robust soft skills, with 'giving presentations', 'discussing conflicting points of view with colleagues' and 'managing a team' topping the list of most daunting tasks.







DRAGONS' APPRENTICE



GRASSROOTS PROGRAMME

Foundation We are really excited to announce our participation in the Grassroots programme: empowering pupils to reduce conflict by positively influencing their peers.

The Education Endowment Fund programme aims to reduce bullying and conflict in schools by empowering a group of pupils to positively impact their peers' prosocial attitudes and behaviours. This trial is being delivered by the Behavioural Insights Team.

As a school, students completed a survey asking them to detail which other pupils they've had contact with recently. The project team then used the answers, along with demographic data, to identify a group of approximately 30 pupils who, between them, can represent the whole student body.

This week the identified students had their first session, one of ten fortnightly sessions over the course of the school year with their assigned trained Research Assistant. During the session, students identified areas for improvement in student interactions and generated possible solutions (for example activities they may do, what they might encourage their friends to do).
