

Coronavirus Contingency Plan

In the event that that the school should close the Global Studies Faculty will put into place the following provision to ensure that disruption to student learning is minimised.

KS3 students – Years 7 – 9

All students will be set appropriate work that fits with the current topic being studied in class. This will be set on ClassCharts and will contain PowerPoints and resources needed for students to be able to work independently to complete work and stay on track. Work will also be placed on the Student Resources Google Drive and the relevant links stated in ClassCharts; so that they are two possible ways to access the work. Work may come in the form of individual lessons as per the school timetable or teachers may choose to use Extended Learning Projects that are designed to build upon prior learning.

KS4 students – Years 10 & 11

In the event of a planned closure, KS4 students will be sent home with their class exercise books and any student resource(s) booklets and or past papers that enable students to continue with their learning and or revision. Class teachers will guide students on which activities to complete via ClassCharts.

Post 16 students – Years 12 & 13

As agreed, teachers will email their class on the Monday and direct students to work on the shared drive. Due to the nature of the closure and as an exception – teachers will accept essays that are typed.
